

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

A. Why 3-to-a-seat?

The maximum capacity for elementary (K-5) buses is 65 students, middle (6-8) and high school (9-12) buses is 52, and an elementary /middle (K-8) is 65. The Student Transportation Office attempts to limit the assigned number of students to 85% capacity for the grade being served.

B. Why do we need to register for every school year?

By having each student re-register for each year the Student Transportation Office can more accurately determine the busing needs for the new school year.

C. How do I change my student(s) bus assignment?

Contact the School Bus Office.

D. What training and certification do the bus drivers have?

All bus drivers are required to have the appropriate Government of Guam license. In addition, all bus drivers are required to be current in First Aid/CPR. At the beginning of the school year all drivers receive training as well as periodic in-service training during the school year.

E. Can parents ride the school bus?

As a general rule parents are not permitted due to the number of students already assigned to the bus.

F. Can I have a different morning and afternoon bus?

Yes, but you can not have a different bus for different days of the week.

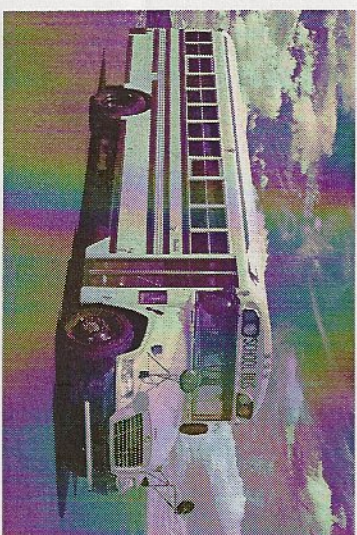
